This is not the case with the Vankyo MatrixPad S10, as there is no bloatware to be found, providing an Almost In Stock Android experience. This 10.1-inch tablet makes media consumption a breeze, along with the 32GB of onboard storage. There is also an 8 megapixel rear camera if you like to take pictures with a huge viewfinder. In addition, there is a microSD card slot to keep many of your favorite contents, photos and videos. Although microSD card support is available on board, it has been limited to supporting cards up to 128GB. This is a disturbing inclusion as you'll end up running out of space if you plan to upload movies and TV shows. The eight hours of battery life probably won't last throughout the day, so you'll want to keep a portable charger around. Not only can you get a portable smart screen, but Lenovo has packed it into two side speakers with Dolby Atmos features. This ensures that your speakers fill the room, even if you don't have the M8 docked. And it's lighter than other 8-inch tablets, making it more portable and easier to carry with you if you need to get on the road. Unfortunately, there are some pitfalls with the Smart Tab M10 HD as it only comes with 2GB of RAM. Those waiting for a multitasking tablet may want to look elsewhere. This makes a little more sense when looking at the dated design with the large photo frames around the display. But if you find a tablet like the Vankyo MatrixPad Z1 with its Android Go certification, you won't have to worry about these problems. These Go applications are optimized to run on basic-level hardware, so you don't slow down when trying to use different applications. As for the tablet itself, vankyo includes 32GB of onboard storage, which can be expanded up to 128GB with a microSD card. The 7-inch screen is pointed at 178-degree viewing angles, which will ensure you can still continue enjoying your content, regardless of how your tablet is being maintained. Some of the possible concerns you may encounter involve the hardware under the display. We would like to see support for more than 128GB of microSD storage expansion, since 32GB is not enough nowadays. The lower density screen won't be as sharp, even on a 7-inch screen, and with only 1GB of RAM, you might end up getting bottle collar even with Android Go.
